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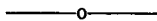

a. This specification is under the jurisdiction of the Committee on Standardization of Production Equipment of the American Petroleum Institute.

Note:

This edition supersedes the 5th edition dated March 1966. It includes changes adopted at the 1970 meeting as reported in Circ PS 1402. Std 11A, *Oil-well Pumps*, has been withdrawn but will remain in print and will be available from the Dallas office for use as a reference manual.

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SECTION I

SCOPE

1.1 This specification covers rod pumps and tubing pumps in commonly used bore sizes. Sufficient dimensional requirements are provided to assure interchangeability of all component parts; however, details of design and material are not specified.

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
